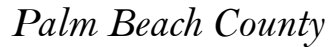

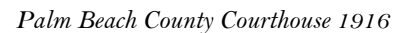

Palm Beach County was carved out of Dade County in 1909, becoming Florida's 47th county. The first county government meetings were held in an old four-room school house at the corner of Clematis Street and Dixie Highway in West Palm Beach. At the time, only about 5,300 people lived in the new county comprised of portions of what are now Broward, Martin and Okeechobee counties. Broward County was established in 1915, Okeechobee County in 1917 and Martin County in 1925.

With its establishment as Florida's 47th county in 1909, Palm Beach County's first Sheriff was appointed by then Governor Guilders. Our county is the third largest in both population and square mileage of all Florida's 67 counties. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) provides law enforcement, civil, and corrections services to the residents of Palm Beach County.

Under the leadership of the Sheriff, a Chief Deputy, two Colonels and one Director manage the activities of three departments, each consisting of several divisions which report to Bureau Managers. **Management Services Bureau** reports directly to the Sheriff, and oversees Human Resources, Internal Affairs, Labor, and Training Divisions, as well as Staff Inspections Unit. Media Relations Division also reports directly to the Sheriff.

Department of Legal Affairs

Legal Affairs serves as general counsel to the Sheriff and provides legal advice and research on law enforcement, corrections, and administrative issues to members of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office.

Department of Law Enforcement Operations

This Department oversees six bureaus. **Countywide Operations Bureau** encompasses initiatives relating to juvenile services, crime prevention and manages law enforcement services provided countywide, including contracts, court services, traffic enforcement, and volunteer support.

Communications Operations Bureau provides countywide support through emergency and non-emergency communications services, oversees agency radio and telephone infrastructure, records management, and telephone/internet reporting services.

Homeland Security Bureau coordinates special operations and emergency response in addition to providing

security at PBIA. This bureau oversees dedicated units such as Aviation, Explosive Ordnance, K-9, Marine Enforcement, Strategic Intelligence, SWAT, and Emergency Field Force (EFF).

South and West Regional Bureaus manage patrol districts and municipal law enforcement contracts within their respective geographical regions.

Strategic Operations Bureau includes all investigative functions, as well as technical service support inclusive of forensic sciences, crime laboratory, crime scene and evidence.

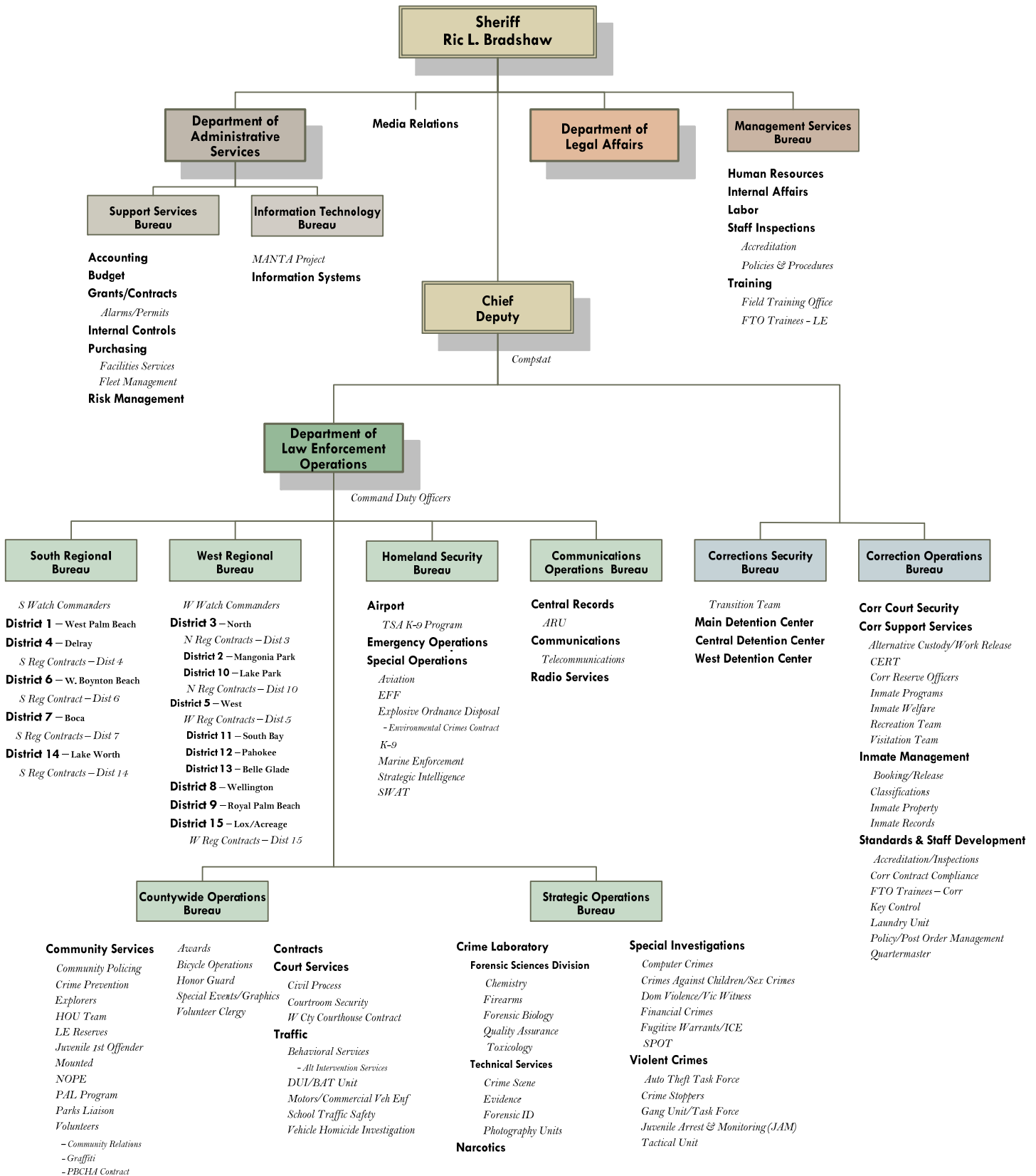
Corrections consists of two bureaus reporting to the Chief Deputy. **Corrections Operations Bureau** is responsible for support functions applicable to the management of inmates. These functions include, but are not limited to, prisoner transportation, booking and release, inmate welfare/programs, visitation, Corrections accreditation program, training, quartermaster and contract compliance. **Corrections Security Bureau** oversees the many activities associated with the safe and secure incarceration of offenders at the Main Detention Center, Central Detention Center, and West Detention Center.

Department of Administrative Services

Support Services Bureau includes accounting, budget, grants and contracts, internal controls, purchasing and risk management. These divisions support the Agency's core operations through development, deployment, and utilization of policies, procedures, and systems for financial management.

Information Technology Bureau is responsible for development of the future technology direction within PBSO, overseeing strategies that assure that direction, and adjusting strategies as necessary. Initiatives include implementation in a cost-effective manner to benefit Law Enforcement as well as the citizens of Palm Beach County.

Alternate Response Unit (ARU)/Lobby

- The Alternate Response Unit completes non-emergency reports for citizens over the phone, in person in the headquarters lobby and via the internet through our CopLogic reporting system
- Facilitates and documents child/children exchanges on weekends
- Assists with completing foreign orders of protection for out of state domestic violence cases
- Verifies and retains information on personal impound and repossessed vehicles
- Notarizes miscellaneous forms for Central Records & Internal Affairs
- Monitors the internal security cameras
- Maintains security for training rooms and classrooms
- Issues Citizen Complaint forms
- Accepts found property and places it in evidence
- Provides VIN verifications
- Provides assistance to the Crime Stoppers program on nights and weekends
- Processes missing persons reports for the Children's Home Society (Safe Harbor)
- Deputies conduct investigations, and arrest persons in the lobby who are found to have active warrants
- Deputies transport prisoners for the detective bureau

Overview of Facilities

Main Detention Center

Located at the Sheriff's Office Headquarters complex on Gun Club road in West Palm Beach. The South Tower, built in 1993 at a cost of \$52 million, is one of the three adjacent buildings that comprise the Main Detention Center. It is a twelve-story high-rise linear structure constructed from concrete and steel. The six story East and West Towers, constructed in 1983, complete the Main Detention Center.

Central Detention Center

While currently closed awaiting the start of renovations, the facility is located on Fairgrounds Road adjacent to the South Florida Fairgrounds and two state correctional facilities. Constructed in 1952, the facility consists of 19 campus style concrete single-story structures and is situated on a 17-acre parcel of land. The latest addition to the facility was completed in 1992.

West Detention Facility

Located 45 miles west of West Palm Beach in Belle Glade. Opened in May 1983, with expansions in 1999 and in 2011, this two story 242,308 square foot state of the art facility is situated on 94 acres of land. The total bed capacity is 998.
