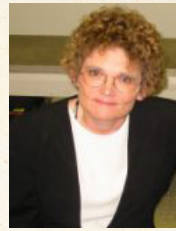

Forensic Genealogy

(Homicides, Missing Persons, Y-Profiles)

Colleen Fitzpatrick, Ph.D.



Colleen Fitzpatrick, PhD, is an internationally recognised forensic genealogist, the founder of Identifinders International. She is known for her innovative approach of applying genetic genealogy to cold case homicides and identity thefts. Her work with the Phoenix Police Department in solving the 1992-1993 Phoenix Canal Murders won

fifth place in the Cold Case DNA Hit of the Year competition out of 61 entries from 14 countries. With her partner Margaret Press, Colleen has founded the DNA Doe Project, a nonprofit organization that applies genetic genealogy techniques to identifying John and Jane Does. The project was recently featured in the national media for solving the 37 year old Buckskin Girl case in only four hours.

Colleen has worked on dozens of cold cases, collaborating with law enforcement agencies, legal firms, and medical examiners on forensic identification. As a world traveler and multi-lingual, Colleen specializes in international cases; she has researched in over 50 countries. She is a past Fellow of the Society of Photoinstrumentation Engineers (SPIE), and currently an Associate Member of the American Academy of Forensic Science (AAFS).

Detective Jeff Lewis, Miami-Dade Police Department (ret.)



Detective Jeff Lewis retired from the Miami-Dade Police Department in 2010. His 30-year career was marked by countless commendations and accolades. Jeff was assigned to the Homicide Bureau during his final 14 years, where he assumed responsibility for hundreds of high-profile,

complex murder investigations. Prior to his tenure in Homicide, Jeff spent 13 years as a Robbery Investigator where he acted as lead detective on thousands of armed robbery cases.

Jeff has also participated in a variety of Federal Task Forces formed to combat extremely violent gangs of robbers, many of whom received national media attention. He has testified in hundreds of state, Federal and civil proceedings. Jeff has successfully collaborated on gang investigations with FDLE (Florida Department of Law Enforcement), the FBI, DEA, ATF and the Secret Service. A number of these cases were prosecuted at the Federal level.
